



Morning Star's shining samples

CHANNEL samples indicating good gold grades have been collected from Morning Star Gold's Woods Point project.

The latest samples were taken at about 240m underground, from the 7L sub-level of the old Morning Star gold mine, formerly operated by Gold Mines of Australia.

Two exposed quartz reefs on the sub-level, towards the northern workings of the mine, were sampled and the company said these would be important in planning future resource definition drilling.

The 35 samples averaged more than 40gpt gold, with two samples recording grades higher than 200gpt, including one sample at 274gpt.

A diamond drill program has also begun at Morning Star South, with the first hole intersecting a previously untested dyke body at 71m.

Shares in Morning Star Gold climbed 4c to close yesterday at 34.5c.
